Provide a description of efforts to reduce homelessness:

The City's Homeless Outreach Team provides shelter referral services and support services, including care coordination to its homeless population. For FY 17/18, the team provided the following services:

- 1,377 homeless passed through our City, encountered by Miami Beach Police Department and the City's Homeless Outreach Team.
- -The City relocated 122 people of these to reunite with family or friends.
- -The City placed 547 people in shelter.
- -Of those placed in shelter, 175 people transitioned to permanent/supportive housing.
- -44 homeless adults were employed by the City's homeless employment program. Hope in Miami-Dade, Inc. Out of the 44 employed, 21 transitioned into permanent employment.
- -Continued offering daily support groups based on the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People for the homeless transitioning away from the streets.
- -Began Homeless Services Transit Pass Project, funded by the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and served 96 homeless households.
- -Continued engaging more civilians in community outreach and joint outreach missions.
