JP Morgan moved that due to the low ridership to Belle Isle, the Transportation, Parking and Bicycle-Pedestrian Facilities Committee asks City to look into proceeding with eliminating Route A & B, keeping the Via 10<sup>th</sup> ST Loop to Belle Isle; seconded by D. Ruggiero, all in favor/none opposed, motion passed (LTC #338-2018)

- Commission Referral (Samuelian): Presentation on Beach Express North Bus Express Rapid Transit (BERT): PowerPoint presented/discussion held/motion passed:

JP Morgan moved that the Transportation, Parking and Bicycle-Pedestrian Facilities Committee recommends that the first pilot program go across the Julia Tuttle Causeway, make a stop at Mt. Sinai, go east on 41st to Collins Ave., go north to 44th and then south on Indian Creek; route should go as far as 23rd and Collins; seconded by A. Ferreira de Melo, all in favor/none opposed, motion passed (LTC #338-2018)
