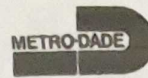

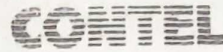

THE CUP STOPS AT GE...

Thanks to the good safety record of CPD employees, the communications business was tapped for the local Industrial Management Club's safety cup, in one of four presentations this month. (SPD employees are in a separate category...not in the same grouping with CPD).

THE CUP, TO BE IN POSSESSION OF GE FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, REPRESENTS A FINE SAFETY RECORD BACK IN JULY OF THIS YEAR. (BECAUSE OF REQUIRED STATISTICS, THERE IS A TIME DELAY.) JIM LAW, FOREMAN-THIRD SHIFT (MACHINED PARTS), A MEMBER OF THE YMCA-RELATED ORGANIZATION FOR SUPERVISORS, ACCEPTED THE CUP AT A MEETING LAST WEEK. LAW, INCIDENTALLY, HAS JUST BEEN NAMED TO THE CLUB'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS. SOME 25 OTHER MEN IN MANAGERIAL AND RELATED POSITIONS AT GE ARE MEMBERS OF THE CLUB.

The news stories report violence, including the dynamiting at a former union member's home. (He had resigned from the union and was working.) Other items highlight added unpleasant incidents -- fights, pushing, smashed car windows, even attempted plant sabotage -- during the long, 88-day union strike. The factual news stories are reprinted from the Rome downtown newspaper, the News Tribune.

LOGOTHETIS: Some Thoughts on Democracy

Even if the Greeks had a word for it,* one young Lynchburger -- born at Piraeus, the port city for Athens, has a keen understanding and appreciation of the word...Democracy.

A TALK WITH VAN LOGOTHETIS, WHO LAST WEEK COMPLETED HIS EXAMINATION FOR U.S. CITIZENSHIP, WILL CONVINCE YOU THAT VAN HAS SPENT CONSIDERABLE TIME IN LEARNING THE REAL MEANING OF DEMOCRACY and CITIZENSHIP.

"We have it here," is Van's philosophy; "and we aren't apt to lose it, as long as we show a continuing concern for the individual's importance."

DRAWING ON HIS FORMER TIES WITH GREECE, VAN POINTS OUT THAT THE KINGDOM (IN CLASSICAL TIMES) PRODUCED CITY STATES WHERE DEMOCRACY SUPPOSEDLY FLOURISHED. "EVEN SO," SAYS VAN, "IN THAT GOLDEN AGE OF ATHENS, LESS THAN HALF THE POPULATION COULD VOTE. AND KEY POSITIONS WERE HELD BY ARISTOCRATS... NOT BY THE COMMON PEOPLE."

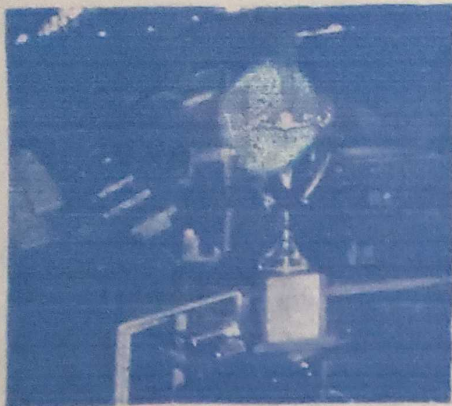

LOGOTHETIS TALKS DEMOCRACY (Cont'd.)

Canadian citizen who soon takes the U.S. oath, maintains.

AND IN HIS POSITION WITH CPD -- WORKING IN TELECOMMUNICATION INSTALLATIONS -- HE HAS HAD OCCASION TO KNOW. IN FACT, VAN HAS VISITED 40 STATES OF THE UNION IN HIS FIVE YEARS OF MICROWAVE SITE SELECTION WORK. HE'S TALKED WITH ALL KINDS OF CITIZENS FROM THE IMPORTANT FARMERS WHO FEED US...TO POLICE CHIEFS WHO PROTECT US...AND MAYORS WHO GOVERN US...IN THE FABRIC OF AMERICANA.

The thing that again impresses him most throughout his experience is the real significance of the individual. "This concept of individualism shows up in the Bill of Rights...as the written desires of Americans to create an environment -- political, economic and social in nature -- where Democracy can be nurtured." This environmental ground will support the seed of democracy, and make it grow.

FURTHER COMMENTING ON THE NATURE OF THE INDIVIDUAL...VAN HAD OTHER INTERESTING OBSERVATIONS TO MAKE.

On the individual and government, he believes that the Federal arm of government is not really becoming too strong, but is in fact, forced into accomplishing necessary objectives which are overlooked or neglected by those who should do the job.

On automation and the individual, Van says that men and women are upgrading their opportunities through this process, and have improved their leisure time, reduced the labor content of their jobs, both thanks to this tool of progress. "Automation," he points out, "can never replace man...but can create a higher demand for skill and knowledge."

On unions and the individual, the student of democracy and citizenship admits that unions were born at a time when they were needed. "If unions were to change their character today, and cooperate with progress -- putting emphasis on retraining and the upgrading of skill -- they could again fulfill a useful mission."

Logothetis left Greece as a 17-year-old lad, to join his Uncle, who operated a restaurant in Canada. There, he took pre-engineering studies at the University of Essex; later took classes at the University of Detroit; and is now completing his E.E. degree at the University of Virginia Extension School. He will soon embark on

a 5-year program which will net him an advanced degree in Business Administration.

In Canada, Van did microwave and tele-communications -- systems radio -- work with Bell Telephone and the Canadian National Railway. On a recruiting trip to Canada, in December of 1959, Al Caldera hired Logothetis for CPD field installation work. Van moved to Lynchburg in 1959...and has been associated with customer installations since that time.

ON ONE TRIP FOR CPD -- WORKING WITH FLORIDA POWER COMPANY -- VAN MET HIS WIFE, HELEN, A NATIVE OF FLORIDA AND AN EX-MARINE. THEY WERE MARRIED FOUR YEARS AGO, AND THEIR SON CELEBRATED HIS FIRST BIRTHDAY LAST FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, WHICH WAS ALSO CITIZENSHIP DAY, VAN PROUDLY POINTS OUT.

Van's present assignment is in Engineering...where he is responsible for outside plant facilities on Southern Railway microwave installations.

The progress of railroads in this country is a striking example of democratic citizenship in action, says Van. Ten years ago, the railroad industry (established to open up our great country) was said to be doomed. Are we going broke? Shall we junk the lines? were questions railroad management had to ask. Instead of having the lines nationalized as in some lands, the free enterprise system created by individual initiative sought a new character...the hauling of freight instead of people...which has become profitable for the industry.

FURTHER COMMENTING ON THE SOUTHERN JOB HERE, VAN SPEAKS KNOWLEDGEABLY OF TREMENDOUS ACCOMPLISHMENTS. "IN THIS PROJECT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ACHIEVE GREAT PROGRESS...WE HAVEN'T LOST A SINGLE DAY AGAINST A TIGHT SCHEDULE ON THE CURRENT PROJECT," HE SAYS: A FINE TRIBUTE TO WORKING TOGETHER, AND TO DEDICATED MANAGEMENT. "IT IS DIFFICULT TO UNDERSTAND HOW WELL ENGINEERING, MARKETING, ACCOUNTING, PURCHASING AND MANUFACTURING HAS SYNCHRONIZED TO PERFORM SO WELL, UNLESS YOU CAN SEE THE RESULTS OF THIS SYSTEM. THIS TEAMWORK ACCOMPLISHED BY ALL WILL HELP AS A SALES TOOL IN OUR FUTURE COMMUNICATIONS GROWTH, OF THIS WE ARE CERTAIN," HE SAYS.

VAN'S COMPREHENSION OF DEMOCRACY AT WORK WOULD PUT TO SHAME MANY GOOD CITIZENS WHO HAVE GROWN UP WITH THE BENEFITS OF A FREE LAND, WITH A TAKE-IT-FOR GRANTED ATTITUDE. WE CAN BE PROUD OF OUR NEW CITIZEN!
