Venetian Island Seawalls



Project Overview and Benefits

Improved and elevated seawalls provide a high degree of protection against coastal flooding and erosion for our low lying community. To prevent both environmental and property damage, new work along the seawall will occur on the breezeway areas where the Venetian Islands pump stations are installed. In addition, renewal and replacement of the seawall and its concrete caps provide added protection against natural elements and will also help shelter the pump stations.

What's New

Beginning this week, crews have commenced pile installation on the easement on North San Marino Island. This work will take place from a barge in the intracoastal waterway with heavy machinery on it. This crew will then move on to work on the easements on Rivo Alto, followed by DiLido Island.



The contractor will simultaneously have carpenter crews working to expedite the project. The carpenter crew will start on DiLido Island the first week of August as well.

Timeline

This project is expected to last approximately four months. Work hours are weekdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; extended time is subject to city approval and community notification.

Please note, the project team is closely monitoring the situation surrounding COVID-19. The contractor is enforcing strict social distancing measures and employees are using face covers while on site, including during break times.

What to Expect

- Pile driving will create vibration and noise.
- Screen fencing surrounding the work zone.
- Local traffic will be provided access at all times.
