

MIAMI BEACH RISING ABOVE

Indian Creek Drive Flooding Mitigation Phase III

Project Advisory - October 16, 2020

Project Overview and Benefits

This project delivers vital improvements to the Indian Creek Drive community by providing new sidewalks, a lighting system and a continuous delineated bicycle path. It will also address flooding within the neighborhood by installing a comprehensive stormwater drainage system, including a pump station and generator in case of a power outage. Additionally, the road and sidewalk will be rebuilt at a higher elevation to mitigate sea level rise.

What's Happening

Reminder: On Sunday evening, October 18, the contractor will be changing the travel lane configuration on 41 Street between Indian Creek Drive and Collins Avenue. Two eastbound lanes will be provided along 41 Street in this area. As part of the project's ongoing detour, motorists traveling in the right lane will be able to turn south onto Collins Avenue or turn north from the left lane onto Collins Avenue. Touch ups to striping along Collins Avenue in the detour area may also be done during this time.

The contractor is expected to work Sunday evening between 9 p.m. and 2 a.m. to implement this change. Minimal noise impacts are anticipated as part of this work.

The following activities are scheduled along Indian Creek Drive:

- Beginning to install drainage along 34 Street
- Beginning roadway work along 32 Street
- Continuing to install the 72-inch drainage pipe along Indian Creek Drive north of 36 Street
- Continuing to install drainage along the east side of Indian Creek Drive north of 36 Street

This schedule may change due to unforeseen conditions or weather.

Timeline

The contractor is expected to work on Sunday evening between 9 p.m. and 2 a.m. to implement this change. Minimal noise impacts are anticipated as part of this work.

Please note, this schedule could change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

What to Expect

- Moderate levels of construction noise are expected during the day
- Construction equipment, machinery and workers will be present at work zone

Please note, the project team is closely monitoring the situation surrounding COVID-19. The contractor is enforcing strict social distancing measures and employees are using face covers while on site, including during break times.



An advisory will be issued every two weeks or as changes in the work takes place.
