

# MIAMIBEACH RISING ABOVE

## Venetian Islands Seawalls

*Project Update - October 16, 2020*

### Project Overview and Benefits

Improved and elevated seawalls provide a high degree of protection against coastal flooding and erosion for our low lying community. To prevent both environmental and property damage, new work along the seawall will occur on the breezeway areas where the Venetian Islands pump stations are installed. In addition, renewal and replacement of the seawall and its concrete caps provide added protection against natural elements and will also help shelter the pump stations.

### What's New

In August, crews commenced seawall construction on the easements throughout the Venetian Islands.

Beginning next week, the contractor will pour concrete for the retaining wall footings on the easements on Rivo Alto Island and will also pour concrete for the retaining wall on the easement on DiLido Island. The following week, October 26, the contractor will pour the final retaining walls on Rivo Alto Island. Following this final seawall pour, the contractor will begin back-filling operations at DiLido Island before moving onto the remaining sites throughout the islands.

### Timeline

This project is expected to last approximately four months. Work hours are weekdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; extended time is subject to city approval and community notification.

Please note, the project team is closely monitoring the situation surrounding COVID-19. The contractor is enforcing strict social distancing measures and employees are using face covers while on site, including during break times.


### What to Expect

- Trucks will be driving fill to the various locations throughout the islands.
- Backfilling operation will create noise.
- Screen fencing will surround the work zone.
- Local traffic will be provided access at all times.
