G.O. Bond #24: Middle Beach Beachwalk

Project Update - May 10, 2021

Project Benefits

This beachside amenity is part of the greater Atlantic Greenway Network (AGN), which aims to support the use of alternative modes of transportation along the Eastern Seaboard. The project replaces the prior raised wooden boardwalk with an approximately 15-foot wide, on-grade, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-accessible paver pathway that supports bicycles, pedestrians and other nonmotorized modes of transportation.

The segment of the Middle Beach Beachwalk from 24 to 29 streets opened on Friday, April 2, 2021.

The segment of the Middle Beach Recreational Corridor (Beachwalk) from 29 to 32 streets and from 36 to 45 streets will be opening starting on Tuesday, May 11, 2021. The opening of this segment will occur from south on 29 street and will proceed north up to 45 street and is expected to take a couple of days.



What's Happening

The City of Miami Beach continues work on the Middle Beach Beachwalk's 11 street-ends between 24 and 45 streets. Please note that some areas may not see work taking place at all times due to the nature of the project.

The following activities are in progress:

- Construction continues at all 11 street-ends except 26 Street.
- The street-end on 26 Street serves as a construction access point.

What to Expect

Temporary beach access will remain open until work at the street ends is completed. They are located at the following streets: 24, 25, 27, 29, 30, 32, 36, 38, 39, 40, 42 and 46.

Public beach access at 26, 37, 41 and 43 streets will be closed during construction.

Please note that beach access may be temporarily closed during concrete work at the street-ends while the formwork is underway. Such closures are expected to last about two days.

Timeline

The project is scheduled for completion in June 2021, but every effort is being made to open up the remaining street-ends as they are completed and it is deemed safe to do so. While most will be open in June, those that served as staging and access points will open later. Work hours are from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Extended hours and weekend work days are subject to city approval and community notification.

Please note, the project team is closely monitoring the situation surrounding COVID-19. The contractor is enforcing strict social distancing measures and employees are using face coverings while on-site, including during breaks. This schedule may change due to

unforeseen conditions or weather.
