Judge Cuervo convened the meeting at 5:03 p.m.

I. Canvassing of presumed invalid Vote-by-Mail ballots.

Robert A. Rodriguez, Miami-Dade Elections, notified the Canvassing Board that 289 additional Vote-by-Mail Ballots had been received since the Canvassing Board last canvassed presumed invalid Vote-by-Mail ballots on November 1, 2021. Of these, 3 are presumed invalid.

The alleged deficiencies for said Vote-by-Mail ballots are:

The signature does not match	1
Voters precinct not voting	1
Already Voted	1
Total Amount	3

Jean Olin, Attorney representing the Canvassing Board, explained to the Canvassing Board, before reviewing the 3 presumed invalid Vote-by-Mail ballots, that signatures declared not matched must be determined by a majority vote of the Canvassing Board and beyond a reasonable doubt.

Mr. Rodriguez explained to the Canvassing Board that one of the 289 Vote-by-Mail ballots was determined by the Miami-Dade County Elections Department Vote-by-Mail Section that the

signature on the Vote-by-Mail Voter Certificate did not match what is on file at the Miami-Dade Elections Department. The Vote-by-Mail ballot was unanimously accepted by the Canvassing Board as matching the signature in the voter registration system. The Vote-by-Mail ballot was marked across the face of the envelope "Accepted as Legal" by Judge Cuervo.

Mr. Rodriguez explained to the Canvassing Board that one of the 289 voters who returned a Vote-by-Mail ballot had already voted. The Canvassing Board unanimously rejected the one Vote-by-Mail Ballot. The Vote-by-Mail ballot was marked across the face of the envelope "Rejected as Illegal" by Judge Cuervo.

Below is a summary of the Canvassing Board's action:

II. Duplication of ballots (as needed).

Miami-Dade Elections personnel showed the Canvassing Board three Vote-by-Mail ballots that were damaged in a way that the electronic vote-counting equipment could not properly count the ballots. The Canvassing Board oversaw the duplication of these ballots.

Miami-Dade Elections personnel showed the Canvassing Board one Vote-by-Mail ballot that had been marked by the voter in a way that the electronic vote-counting equipment could not properly count the ballot. The Canvassing Board first looked at the entirety of each ballot for consistency to determine whether the voter had made a definite choice in a contest. After unanimously determining that voter intent was clear in the race(s) or on the measure(s) for which the voting equipment could not detect voter intent in the ballot, the Canvassing Board oversaw the duplication of this ballot.

The Canvassing Board recessed from approximately 5:40 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

III. Tabulation of Results

Tabulations of results commenced.

Miami-Dade Elections personnel showed the Canvassing Board one Election Day ballot that had been marked by the voter in a way that the electronic vote-counting equipment could not properly count the ballot. The Canvassing Board first looked at the entirety of each ballot for consistency to determine whether the voter had made a definite choice in a contest. After unanimously determining that voter intent was clear in the race(s) or on the measure(s) for which the voting equipment could not detect voter intent in the ballot, the Canvassing Board oversaw the duplication of this ballot.

IV. Unofficial Official Results

Robert A. Rodriguez, Miami-Dade Elections, presented the Canvassing Board with the Unofficial Results of the November 2, 2021 General and Special Election. The members of the Canvassing Board accepted and signed the result copies. Attached as Exhibit "A" is the Summary Report showing the Unofficial Results for the November 2, 2021 City of Miami Beach General and Special Elections. These results include Vote-by-Mail, Early Voting, and Election Day ballots cast.

On Thursday, November 4, 2021, upon the Canvassing Board canvassing of the Vote-by-Mail and provisional ballots (as needed), the Miami-Dade County Elections Department will furnish the Canvassing Board with the Official Results.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 11:14 p.m.
