G.O. Bond #24: Middle Beach Beachwalk

Project Update - November 24, 2021

What's Happening

Starting today, the street-ends located at 40 and 43 streets were reopened. The contractor will continue to finalize the remaining street-ends in the corridor.

The following activities are in progress:

- Installation of concrete bands, landscaping, irrigation, pavers, lighting, benches, showers and sidewalk restoration continues at different street-ends located at 26, 27, 39 and 41 streets.

Project Benefits

This beachside amenity is part of the greater Atlantic Greenway Network (AGN), which aims to support the use of alternative modes of transportation along the Eastern Seaboard. The project replaces the prior raised wooden boardwalk in this area with an approximately 15-foot wide, on-grade, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-accessible paver pathway that supports bicycles, pedestrians and other nonmotorized modes of transportation.



The Middle Beach Beachwalk has been open from 24 to 45 streets since May 2021.

What to Expect

Beach access is located at the following streets: 24, 25, 29, 30, 31, 32, 36, 37, 38, 40, 42 and 43.

Please note that some areas in the work zone may not have workers present at all times due to the nature of the project.

Timeline

The completion of the street-ends has been impacted by a shortage of materials and unforeseen site conditions. The project is scheduled for completion in late January/ early February 2022, but every effort is being made to open the remaining street-ends as soon as it is safe to do so.

Work hours are from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Extended hours and weekend work days are subject to city approval and community notification.
