



## **GENERAL FAQ**

### **What is the purpose of the march?**

After the most recent shootings in Parkland, the purpose of the national youth-led March For Our Lives movement is to advocate for gun control and mental health counseling.

### **Who is hosting the march?**

The City of Miami Beach along with Miami-based youth leaders are proud to host the Miami-Dade County iteration of the national March For Our Lives Movement.

### **Is March For Our Lives Miami affiliated with the national March For Our Lives movement?**

Yes, we are a registered sibling march of the national movement.

### **Who is allowed to march?**

Everyone. All ages are welcome. Families are encouraged to attend and carpool!

### **Can organized groups attend the march?**

Yes! We encourage all schools and organizations to attend, and highly recommend organizing a bus for your group to attend the march all together.

## **EVENT DAY FAQ**

### **At what time and where should I arrive?**

To participate in the march, please arrive at 8:00am at Miami Beach Senior High School, located at 2231 Prairie Avenue. The march will begin at 10:00am and travel to Collins Park (approximately a 15 minute walk). At 10:45am there will be a rally/speaking program. At 12 noon, participants will parade back to Beach High.

### **Where can I park?**

Parking facilities in the City of Miami Beach are expected to fill up very quickly. Consider making arrangements to take a charter/shuttle bus, use Miami-Dade Transit bus service or take a ride sharing service.

Lyft will be facilitating a limited amount of free rides within city limits for anyone attending the march. Visit [www.lyft.com](http://www.lyft.com) for details.

Miami Beach Trolleys connect to various parking garages and operations begin at 6 a.m. For information on this free service and to view routes, visit [www.miamibeachrolley.com](http://www.miamibeachrolley.com).

Parking for the March will be available at the **City Hall Garage** located at 1755 Meridian Avenue (entrance on Meridian Avenue and 18<sup>th</sup> Street) with free shuttle service to Beach High.

Additional parking is available at the **17<sup>th</sup> Street Garage** (entrance at 17<sup>th</sup> and Convention Center Drive) as well as **Pennsylvania Avenue Garage** (adjacent to 17<sup>th</sup> Street Garage, with an entrance on Pennsylvania Avenue and Lincoln Lane North, right off of 17<sup>th</sup> Street).

Parking will also be available at Miami Beach Senior High entrance on Dade Boulevard and Prairie Avenue – but is very limited, first come, first serve.

### **What should I wear/bring?**

We recommend wearing comfortable clothing and shoes, bringing water, and sunscreen, and to prepare for the weather. Please, do NOT bring backpacks, large bags, chairs, tents, or umbrellas.

### **What if it rains?**

The march will go on, rain or shine!

### **What is the distance of the march?**

The march is approximately .5 miles, a 15-minute walk.

### **What if I am unable to walk?**

We will have City of Miami Beach staff and officers on site to assist with your needs during the march and rally.

### **What is the cost to attend the march?**

Free!

### **Will there be restrooms?**

Yes, there will be portable restroom facilities available on the north side of Collins Park.

### **Will there be concessions?**

No.
