

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for the City of Miami Beach's Fire Station 2 repairs due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 05439). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the AE Zone, otherwise known as the area of 100-yr flooding, per Miami-Dade County FIRM Panel #12086C0317 L, dated 09/11/2009.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** The City of Miami Beach repaired an awning, roof and glass block, an HVAC controller, chain link fence and hardware, and replaced a tv and mounting equipment at Fire Station 2. Repairs restored the facility back its pre-disaster design, function, and capacity within the existing footprint.
- Project Alternatives:** The alternative that has been considered is the no action alternative. This alternative is not feasible as the area will remain vulnerable to damages, including property damage and hazards to human life and safety. With the no action alternative, negative impacts on residents and the community may be experienced. Alternate locations were not considered as the damaged elements are part of a larger facility and relocating the entire fire station would not be practicable.
