- V. Update on Nikki Beach Lot:** Colette Satchell/CIP stated lot will be ready by mid-July; Staff to contact Nikki Beach for use of spaces

Motion 1:

S. Reed moved that the Transportation, Parking and Bicycle-Pedestrian Facilities Committee asks for the following – seconded by K. Smarsh, all in favor/none opposed, motion passed:

- ***Move barriers to accommodate for two (2) lanes of traffic***
- ***Maintain speed limit signs at 20 mph***
- ***Remove and relocate if possible, parking spaces between 28th and 30th Street, where necessary***

Motion 2:

JP Morgan moved that the Transportation, Parking and Bicycle-Pedestrian Facilities Committee furthermore asks that FDOT be compelled to attend Committee meeting(s) to discuss this project, seconded by K. Smarsh, all in favor/none opposed, motion passed

VII. Transportation Department Items/Updates:

- **395 Bike Lane Project:** Discussion held/ FDOT letter provided to Committee; enhanced bicycle lanes construction project delayed until July 2020
- **Update on MD-Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Study – affects Collins Ave (A1A from Aventura Mall to South Pointe):** yearlong study

S. Reed moved that the Transportation, Parking and Bicycle-Pedestrian Facilities Committee recommends that the City contact the Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) to schedule public meetings and have the public be engaged in the planning process, seconded by L. Bertrand; eleven in favor, one opposed (JP Morgan) – motion passed (LTC #349-2019)

Guests/Residents: Mario Coryell and Jackie Zimmer – issue with Zone 5 parking permit being too expensive, compared to other zones; discussion will be held next month; Committee recommended residential zone pricing should be included on City's website

A. Feola suggested reaching out to County to have Miami-Dade Transit attend next meeting

- **Electric “Foot” Scooter Ban:** Update provided – municipalities can regulate; A. Feola asked that this come to Committee first with options before it goes to NCAC (next month)
