A select number of applicants will be called back for auditions based on the talent listed and the performer’s biography.

Auditions for Seniors Got Talent will be held on February 20, 2020 at the North Shore Park Youth Center, 501 72 Street, where contestants will perform before a panel of judges. Judges will evaluate each contestant and announce six finalists at the end of the auditions.

The Seniors Got Talent finals will take place on March 19, 2020 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Miami Beach Convention Center, where the finalists will perform before a live audience and a panel of judges.
