G.O.B.: Nautilus Traffic Calming Project

Project Update - July 24, 2021

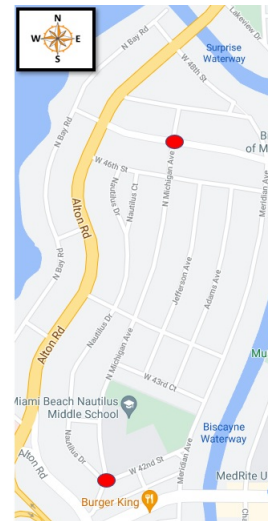
Project Benefits

As part of the G.O. Bond, the City of Miami Beach is implementing various improvements in neighborhoods with heavy traffic and frequent speeding incidents. Traffic calming improvements may include traffic circles, speed humps, designated bike lanes and reduced speed signage. During this phase of the project, the contractor will add two traffic circles at neighborhood entry points to reduce excessive speeding as well as cut-through traffic.

Locations of planned traffic circles are shown in red on the adjacent map.

What's Happening

Starting on Monday, July 26, the contractor will begin mobilizing for the construction of two traffic circles along North Michigan Avenue. The traffic circles will be located on North Michigan Avenue where it intersects with 42 and 47 streets. The scope of work includes hardscape enhancements, new pavement markings, new signage, landscaping, and utility adjustments.



What to Expect

- Pedestrian access and deliveries will be maintained at all times.
- Expect changes to the traffic pattern. Temporary closures and detours may be necessary.
- Moderate levels of construction noise can be expected during the day.
- Construction equipment, machinery and workers will be present at the job site.
- Parking restrictions will be in place and enforced by the Miami Beach Parking Department. Please heed the signage.
- Intersections along N Michigan Avenue at 42 Street and 47 Street will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the construction.

Timeline

This phase of construction is scheduled to start on Monday, July 26 and expected to take approximately eight weeks for each traffic circle. Construction work hours are weekdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. This schedule may change due to unforeseen conditions or weather.
