Project Benefits

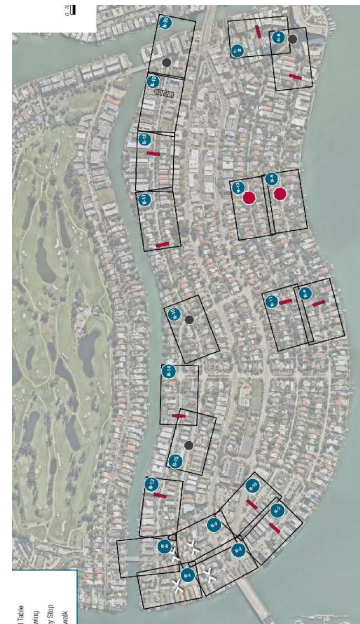
The City of Miami Beach is in the planning phase for traffic calming as well as pedestrian and intersection improvements for the Bayshore and Normandy Isle neighborhoods. The goal of these improvements is to provide a safer experience for all residents and visitors through reduced speeds and increased visibility of pedestrians and bicyclists. The neighborhood map (rights) shows the locations of proposed improvements based on the findings of a circulation and traffic calming study.

What's Happening

The following improvements are planned:

Normandy Isle Neighborhood

- Traffic Circles
- Speed Tables
- Narrowing (Reduced Lane Widths)
- All-Way Stops
- Crosswalks



What to Expect

- Pedestrian access and deliveries will be maintained at all times.
- Temporary parking restrictions may be in place and enforced by the Miami Beach Parking Department during work hours.
- Temporary closures and detours may be necessary so please expect changes to the traffic pattern.
- Moderate levels of construction noise can be expected during work hours.
- Construction equipment, machinery and workers will be present in the work zone.

Timeline

The planning phase is close to completion and the design phase will begin shortly.
