A meeting of the Sustainability Committee was scheduled for May 24, 2022 at 3:00 pm. The meeting was held through Zoom.

1. Committee Responsibilities

- **b.** Review of the April 28, 2022 Minutes MOTION: Motion to approve April 28, 2022 meeting minutes. Motion made by Johann Moore, seconded by Maria Algarra.

2. Sustainability Committee Work Plan

- a. New Business
 - i. Chief Resilience Officer and Environment and Sustainability Department Assistant Director – Amy Knowles, Chief Resilience Officer, and Lindsey Precht, Environment and Sustainability Department Assistant Director, introduced themselves and provided an overview of their roles.
 - ii. Monument Island Margarita Kruyff, chair, presented the item. John Gardiner, Miami Beach resident, presented to the committee his concerns over the future use of Monument Island. Mr. Gardiner suggested designating the island as a native area to avoid its continued degradation. The committee discussed measures that could help address residents' concerns of Monument Island. MOTION: In line with its October 28, 2021, motion, the Sustainability Committee recommends that enhancements of Flagler Monument Island prioritize:
 - Enriching natural habitat;
 - Non-motorized use;
 - o Improving resident use, with equal access to all city residents; and
 - Calming the island.

Motion made by Jason Koslowe seconded by Johann Moore.

iii. Plastic Straw Ordinance – Alyssia Berthoumieux, Senior Sustainability Coordinator, presented the item. Manny Villar, Code Compliance Manager, provided an overview of the City's plastic straw and litter Ordinances. Mr. Villar stated that in the last 12 months, 11 straw

violations have been issued. Michael DeFilippi, member, recommended having another push from the City on education about the Plastic Straw Ordinance. Mr. Villar mentioned that efforts will be more focused but will require 3-4 months to conduct a sweep by Code Compliance. Ms. Kruyff requested bringing the item back to the September meeting for an update. Maria Algarra, member, suggested an update to how bioplastics are addressed in the Ordinance.

iv. Littering Enforcement – Mr. Villar provided an overview of littering enforcement in Miami Beach.

b. Old Business

- at the last committee meeting and expressed interest in pursuing the installation of storm drain grates in Miami Beach. Mr. Moore suggested the City gather data from the City of Miami pilot and present the findings in six months. Mr. DeFilippi suggested getting input from other local municipalities such as the City of Aventura and Sunny Isles Beach and launching a pilot in Miami Beach, in an area with less vegetation to minimize maintenance needs. The committee discussed other conditions that would be ideal for a pilot. **MOTION:** The Sustainability Committee urges the Mayor and City Commission to explore other communities' experiences and successes with installing storm drain grates, including City of Aventura, and install storm drain grates in areas with high levels of litter and minimal shrubs and trees, such as Washington Ave and Alton Road, that can be regularly maintained. Motion made by Michael DeFilippi, seconded by Johann Moore.
