The burglary happened around 3 a.m. Wednesday, Dec. 27, on Bath Club Boulevard North in North Redington Beach, the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office says.

76-year-old man finds wife battling attacker and he starts shooting, Florida cops say

A burglary suspect was sent running for his life when a 76-year-old Florida homeowner heard his wife's screams and began shooting, according to investigators.

The intruder was wounded but survived to be arrested in the street by deputies, the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office reported in a news release.

The homeowner was not hurt, but his wife suffered non-life threatening injuries in the attack, officials said.

It happened around 3 a.m. Wednesday, Dec. 27, in North Redington Beach, a coastal community just west of St. Petersburg, the sheriff's office says.

Deputies were summoned to the residential neighborhood by reports of a man standing in the road and "yelling."

"While deputies were responding to the initial call, a second 911 call was received at 3:23 a.m. at 208 Bath Club Boulevard North, reporting a residential burglary," the sheriff's office said.

"Upon arrival, deputies located (a man) in the roadway on Bath Club Boulevard with a single gunshot wound."

The wounded 51-yearold man also proved to be their burglary suspect, officials said.

He is accused of gaining entry in a home by smashing out a front window with a rock, detectives say.

"Once inside the residence, (he) encountered (a 74-year-old woman) and began to struggle with her physically," the sheriff's office said.

"(Her husband) heard her scream his name in distress and saw her struggling with (a man). Fearing for his and his wife's safety, (he) retrieved his firearm and shot (the man) once in the right shoulder."

The suspect fled the home, then tried to break into another residence on the street, officials said.

"After the failed second burglary attempt, (he) fled down the street, where he was stopped by responding deputies," officials said.

The suspect was taken to a hospital for treatment of non-life-threatening injuries.

He is charged with burglary with battery and attempted residential burglary, the sheriff's office said.

One of my favorite stories was writing about Tanzie, a shelter cat at the **Humane Society of** Greater Miami, who had been waiting for a forever home for six years.

Miami billionaire Griffin. Geffen give \$400 million to fight cancer

Billionaires Ken Griffin and David Geffen pledged \$400 million to the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York, the biggest single donation in the center's 150-year histo-

The announcement was made Tuesday on ABC's "Good Morning America," where Griffin was joined by MSK Chief Executive Officer Selwyn M. Vickers and the show's anchor Robin Roberts, a multiple cancer survivor.

Their message underscored the growing urgency to combat cancer, with projections from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicating a nearly 50% increase in

cancer cases in the US by 2050.

MSK, founded in 1884 and anchored in Manhattan's Upper East Side, has been expanding its footprint. The center is planning a new tower on its main campus and has expanded to buildings in Midtown.

"David and I are honored to support MSK's incredible physicians and scientists advancing breakthroughs in research and treatment and the outstanding nurses and staff who dedicate their lives to providing compassionate care to those impacted by this disease," Griffin said in a statement.

Griffin — who moved from Chicago to Miami last year and has a net worth of \$36.5 billion, according to the Bloomberg Billionaires

Index — has been spreading his wealth across the U.S. In the past year, Harvard renamed a school in honor of the Citadel founder following a \$300 million donation. He also funded a new surgical tower for a Miami children's hospital and a leadership institute for the Texas-based National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation.

In September, he launched Griffin Catalyst, a new brand for his philanthropic activities.

Attention, Walmart shoppers — testing found listeria in one of your food products

A chicken dish sold at over 4,200 Walmart stores under one the chain's house brands was recalled Wednesday after the ready-to-eat meal tested positive for listeria.

Freshness Guaranteed Chicken Fried Rice, Lot No. WK10CFR with a best by date of Nov. 10, 2024, should be returned to the store for a refund or thrown in the garbage. As is its custom, Walmart quickly posted an 89-page PDF with stores that sold the chicken fried rice.

The USDA Food Safety Inspection Service's recall notice said: "The problem was discovered by FSIS

during review of testing results, which showed the product tested positive for (listeria)."

Listeria doesn't infect many each year, about 1,600 in the United States according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, but it kills about 260 people. People over 65, pregnant women and newborns tend to be the most vulnerable to listeria's worst effects. Most people will feel like they have the flu, have headaches, fever and neck stiffness.

Garland Ventures of Garland, Texas, issued the recall of over 18,400 dishes it made for Wal-

Can you take video of police during a traffic stop or arrest?

Here's what to know about the law in Florida:

CAN YOU TAKE VIDEO OF A TRAFFIC STOP OR AN ARREST?

The simple answer is ... Yes, you can take video of police officers making traffic stops or arrests in Florida, either from your own vehicle or on public property like a sidewalk, the street or the beach.

"Florida police on active duty can be recorded on cell phones or other recording devices as they are considered public figures and not afforded a reasonable expectation of privacy," according to the Fusco Law Group in Jacksonville...

But know this ... You can still get in trouble, according to Florida law. That law makes clear that it's illegal to disrupt a police investigation — and that can be up to an officer's interpretation.

"When the person points his or her camera at the police while the officers are on duty, it is possible to interfere with an investigation or an arrest. If the person capturing video gets in the way, causes the arrest to fail or interferes with these actions, he or she can obstruct the duties of the officers. Then, he or she can then face charges for the current activity of obstructing justice," according to the legal resources site HG.org.

HOW ABOUT TAKING VIDEO OF POLICE?

"Florida statute ... in-

dicates that 'parties' don't include police if they are both active and in a public setting. This is because active-duty police officers aren't afforded a reasonable expectation of privacy because they are defined as public figures," according to the Lopez Law Group in St. Petersburg.

Savs the Weinstein legal Team of Fort Lauderdale: "It is legal to record on-duty police officers engaged in police work in Florida, so you can legally record them during a traffic stop. However, you should use common sense and follow a few basic rules. You should also be aware that you might be arrested, even though you are not doing anything illegal. And, if you've followed the rules, you will probably not be convicted of any criminal charges.

"If you record the police during a traffic stop, they might harass you, confiscate your device, or even go so far as to arrest you on charges such as disorderly conduct, violation of wiretapping laws, or obstruction of justice. They cannot arrest and charge you for recording police officers, since it is not illegal to do so."

EFFORTS TO CHANGE THE LAW?

Case: In 2021, the Fourth District Court of Appeal ruled that a Palm Beach County woman should not have been arrested for videotaping police. The appeals court said Sharron Tasha Ford had the right to turn on her camera on Boynton Beach police in 2009

after stopping her son for sneaking into a movie theater, according to a report by the Palm Beach Post.

"A rule otherwise would mean that everyone who pulls out a cell phone to record an interaction with police, whether as a bystander, a witness, or a suspect, is committing a crime," Judge Martha Warner wrote earlier when the court originally sided with police. "If that were the case, then had the individual who recorded George Floyd saving to the officers, 'I can't breathe' been in Florida, she would have been guilty of a crime."

The Post reported on the reversal: The three-judge panel reversed itself and joined Warner, "agreeing that police officers have no expectation of privacy when they are performing their duties in public. Therefore, they agreed, Ford shouldn't have been arrested for violating the state's wiretapping laws."

New legislation: Bills filed this year in Florida would have given police officers greater authority to arrest people trying to take video of them, making it illegal to approach within 20 feet of a police officer. The bills died before a full vote in the Legislature.

ADVICE IF YOU ARE TAKING VIDEO OF POLICE IN ACTION

ACLU Florida offers these tips if you plan to record police action:

- Announce that you are recording what is going on.
- Stay a reasonable distance away from whatever activity you are recording.
- Do not interfere with the police's actions while recording.

Can drivers pass a red light that doesn't turn green? What Florida law says about that

We don't have much patience on the road in Miami. Drivers want to be on the move despite gridlock, slow-poke tourists and people paying more attention to their cellphone than the light that just turned green.

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF A TRAFFIC LIGHT DOESN'T CHANGE?

● There is no law in Florida allowing a driver to pass a solid red light that doesn't change to green. That means you are risking a ticket if you run the red, even if the coast is clear. One thing to know: A light that doesn't seem to change may just be taking longer than you're

used to, or have patience for — it doesn't mean it's broken.

- Some states have what is called a "Dead Red Law," which allows bicyclists and motorcyclists to run a red that isn't triggered by their vehicle. Florida isn't one of them, according to the Murphy Law Group in Sarasota.
- If a red light isn't changing to green, police and traffic advocates suggest pulling up to the intersection line, then rolling your vehicle back and forth to trip the light sensor in the pavement. If that doesn't work, turn right on red when the coast is clear. Then report the faulty light to 511. A sensor may not recognize a bicycle, motorcycle or lighter vehicle, or just be

faulty no matter the vehicle size.

• If you do pass what you think is a stuck light and get caught, you can take it to court.

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF A TRAFFIC LIGHT IS NOT WORKING BUT FLASHING?

Florida law is clear on what drivers have to do if they approach an intersection with a flashing red or yellow light:

Red: According to Florida law, drivers who approach a flashing red light need to stop, check for traffic, then proceed through the intersection.

Yellow: Drivers who approach a flashing yellow light must proceed with caution, Florida law says.
