Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board

Composition:

Pursuant to Miami Beach City Charter Section 8.91, the "Charter shall be reviewed ten (10) years from November 3, 1993 and each tenth year thereafter." Periodic review of the City Charter is in the public interest to ensure the City Charter reflects the organization, powers and essential functions of City government desired by the City's voters. The next required Charter review is scheduled to take place in 2023; however, nothing in the Charter precludes the City Commission from initiating Charter review at an earlier date. A review of the City's Charter has previously been accomplished by the creation and appointment of an Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board ("Ad Hoc Board") to be composed of seven members appointed by the Mayor and City Commission. There are currently multiple proposals by several Commissioners on how to address City Commission vacancies, and creation of the Ad Hoc Board is necessary to provide the Committee sufficient time to thoughtfully deliberate and make recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission. As such, the Mayor and City Commission desire to initiate the Charter Review process immediately, and to convene the Committee as soon as reasonably possible in order to give the Committee sufficient time to thoroughly vet and deliberate all proposals regarding filling City Commission vacancies and review and make recommendations with regard to other provisions of the City Charter.

The Board to is be composed of 7 direct appointments by the Mayor and individual City Commissioners.

At the June 20, 2022, City Commission meeting, the Mayor and City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2022-32234, establishing the Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board ("Charter Review Board"). Unfortunately, due to the untimely passing of Commissioner Mark Samuelian, the Charter Review Board was unable to commence its work for approximately six (6) months, and was not fully constituted until after December 14, 2022, when the Mayor and City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2022-32448, to provide for newly elected Group II City Commissioner Laura Dominguez to make a direct appointment to the Charter Review Board. At its April 25, 2023 meeting, the Charter Review Board unanimously recommended that the Mayor and City Commission extend the term of the Board for six months, to allow the Board sufficient time to gather input from the City's Charter Officers, Elected Officials, and other interested stakeholders, and carefully vet proposed amendments to the City Charter. The Charter Review Board further recommends that the City follow the precedent set by the Charter Review Board of 2013/14 and elect not to place proposed Charter amendments on the same ballot as the 2023 General Election, at which the City's voters will be electing the Mayor and three City Commissioners, in an effort to avoid unduly politicizing Charter questions and, instead, submit any Charter-related ballot questions to the voters as part of the November 5, 2024 election. The Charter Review Board aims to conclude its fact-finding, research, and recommendations by May or June of 2024, to allow the City Commission sufficient time to review proposed Charter amendments, and corresponding ballot questions, prior to the Miami-Dade County Elections Department's deadline for the November 5, 2024 ballot.

On May 17, 2023, the Mayor and City Commission amended Resolution No. 2022-32448 to extend the term of the City of Miami Beach Ad Hoc Charter Review and Revision Board ("Charter Review Board") for an additional six (6) month period, with the new sunset date to be June 30, 2024, in order to provide the Charter Review Board with sufficient time to thoughtfully deliberate and make recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission regarding proposed amendments to the City Charter, for potential consideration by the City's voters as part of the November 5, 2024 election.

Ad Hoc Iguana Remediation Advisory Committee

Composition:

A. Purpose

1. On June 28, 2023, Resolution No. 2023-32650 re-established the Ad Hoc Iguana Remediation Advisory Committee for a period of one year (subject to earlier or later sunset by the City Commission), to study what actions other jurisdictions have taken to address iguana invasions and making recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission regarding iguana mitigation removal options.
2. The Committee will meet on a monthly basis, or as frequently as the Committee deems necessary to make final recommendations. The Committee will sunset on June 28, 2024, unless determined by the Mayor and City Commission that it should be extended.

B. Membership Composition

1. The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) direct appointments made by individual City Commissioners and the Mayor.
2. Membership criteria for the Committee: individuals must be residents of the City for a minimum of two (2) years, or demonstrate ownership/interest in, or employment relationship with a business established in the City for a minimum of two (2) years. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission for individuals with specific knowledge or expertise relative to iguana remediation or other invasive nonnative species remediation.

C. Powers and duties

The Committee will serve to study actions taken by other jurisdictions to prevent, eradicate, and control the spread of invasive iguanas and advise the City Manager and the City Commission on potential actions available to the City in addition to contracting with an iguana mitigation and removal services, including, without limitation, recommendations regarding the Administration's competitive solicitation for iguana mitigation providers.

D. Conflict of interest.

In accordance with Florida law, under circumstances presenting a conflict of interest, an advisory board member should abstain from voting with respect to any measure in which the advisory board member has a personal, private, or professional interest and which inures to his special private gain or the special gain of a principal by whom he is retained. The City Attorney's Office liaison shall assist advisory board members in addressing any potential voting conflicts, as necessary.

E. Administrative Liaison

The supporting departments for the Committee shall be the City Manager's Office, and the Public Works Department. The City Attorney's Office shall provide counsel to the Committee.

A quorum shall consist of three (3) or more members.

Ad Hoc Permitting Process Improvement Advisory Committee

Composition:

A. Purpose

1. The purpose of the Ad Hoc Building Department Improvement Advisory Committee (the "Committee") would be to comprehensively assess and evaluate the City's Building Department's permitting process and identify recommendations for streamlining the permit process and improving the customer service experience with the public.
2. The Committee will meet on a monthly basis, or as frequently as the Committee deems necessary to make final recommendations. The Committee will sunset after one year unless determined by the Mayor and City Commission that it should be extended.

B. Membership Composition, Knowledge and Experience

1. The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) at-large appointments made by the Mayor and City Commission as a body.
2. Membership criteria for the Committee: individuals must be residents of the City for a minimum of two (2) years, or demonstrate ownership/interest in, or employment relationship with a business established in the City for a minimum of two (2) years. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission for individuals with specific knowledge or expertise relative to regulatory permit processes.
3. Members shall possess the following knowledge and expertise:
 - a. One (1) general contractor member with permitting experience within the past five (5) years in the City of Miami Beach;
 - b. Two (2) members with experience as a permit expediter within the past five (5) years in any municipality;
 - c. One (1) member with experience as a plan reviewer within the past five (5) years in any municipality;
 - d. One (1) member with experience as an inspector within the past five (5) years in any municipality;
 - e. Two (2) residents that have built or made improvements to their own properties in the City of Miami Beach within the past five (5) years, regardless of the scale of the project.
4. Members of the Committee shall select a chairperson by majority vote at the Committee's first meeting.

C. Power and Duties.

The Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- a. To request the presence of a representative from each supporting department, as needed, at its meetings.
- b. To review the adopted action items from the Berry Dunn August 31, 2023 report.
- c. To make recommendations to refine and optimize the Berry Dunn suggestions where possible.
- d. To generate new recommendations based on the Committee's insights, experiences, and observations.
- e. To prepare and submit a report to the City Commission with the Committee's findings and recommendations.

Affordable Housing Advisory Committee

Composition:

The Affordable Housing Advisory Committee shall consist of 11 voting members, each of whom shall have a two-year term. One member of the committee shall be the mayor or a member of the city commission, appointed at-large by a majority vote of the mayor and city commission. The remaining 10 members shall be appointed at-large by a majority vote of the mayor and city commission and must include members from at least six (6) of the following categories:

1. One citizen actively engaged in the residential home building industry in connection with affordable housing;
2. One citizen actively engaged in the banking or mortgage banking industry in connection with affordable housing;
3. One citizen who is a representative of those areas of labor actively engaged in home building in connection with affordable housing;
4. One citizen actively engaged as an advocate for low-income persons in connection with affordable housing;
5. One citizen actively engaged as a for-profit provider of affordable housing;
6. One citizen actively engaged as a not-for-profit provider of affordable housing;
7. One citizen actively engaged as a real estate professional in connection with affordable housing;
8. One citizen who actively serves on the local planning agency pursuant to Florida Statute §163.3174 (Planning Board member);
9. One citizen who resides within the jurisdiction of the local governing body making the appointments;
10. One citizen who represents employers within the jurisdiction;
11. One citizen who represents essential services personnel, as defined in the local housing assistance plan.

If the City, due to the presence of a conflict of interest by prospective appointees, or other reasonable factor, is unable to appoint a citizen actively engaged in these activities in connection with affordable housing, a citizen engaged in the activity without regard to affordable housing may be appointed.

Black Affairs Advisory Committee

Composition:

The Black Affairs Advisory Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- (a) Serve in an advisory capacity to the City Manager and the Mayor and City Commission concerning issues and programs affecting the City's Black residents, businesses and visitors;
- (b) Foster increased involvement by the City's Black community in the affairs of City government;
- (c) Research, discuss, and formulate recommendations on issues, activities, and concerns of the Black community and diaspora in the City;
- (d) Comment upon existing or proposed legislation, ordinances, resolutions, and policies that impact the Black community in the City.

The Black Affairs Advisory Committee shall be composed of nine (9) voting members as follows:

The Mayor and each City Commissioner shall appoint one member as a direct appointment, with the remaining two (2) members to be at-large appointments of the City Commission.

Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by the Mayor and City Commission. In filling any vacancy, the Mayor and City Commission may select a replacement committee member from a list of three candidates which shall be submitted by the remaining members of the committee. The individual members of the City Commission may supplement the committee's suggested list with additional names of candidates or, if neither the candidates on the committee's suggested list nor the additional names submitted by the individual members of the City Commission are approved, the committee shall submit an entirely different list for the Mayor and City Commission's Consideration. This process shall continue until a suitable replacement has been found to fill the existing or anticipated vacancy. The suggested list submitted by the committee for the Mayor and City Commission's consideration shall be submitted without specific recommendations or endorsements by the committee as to any particular name submitted therein, but may, in the event the name of a current committee member is submitted for reappointment, indicate, as a point of information to the Mayor and City Commission, that said name is that of an existing committee member.

Knowledge and Experience:

- a) One member must be a business owner in the City;
- b) One member must be a licensed and actively practicing in the field of real estate, hospitality/tourism, or banking;
- c) One member must be licensed and actively practicing in the field of human relations/people development, communications / entertainment, art / culture, or education;
- d) The remaining six (6) members must have a personal or professional knowledge or expertise in at least one of the following areas:
 1. Education
 2. Economic Development/Business Development
 3. Culture/Entertainment/Events
 4. Hospitality/Tourism
 5. Healthcare/Technology
 6. People Development/Human Relations
 7. Finance/Banking
 8. Media/Communications/Public Relations
 9. Community Service/Social Justice.

The supporting department for the Black Affairs Advisory Committee shall be the Tourism and Culture Department.

Board of Adjustment

Composition:

The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and duties:

(1) To hear and decide appeals pursuant to the procedural requirements of Section 118-9.

(2) To authorize, upon application, such variance from the terms of these land development regulations where authorized by section 118-351(a), pursuant to the requirements of chapter 118, article VIII, of the land development regulations, as will not be contrary to the public interest when, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of a provision of these land development regulations would result in unnecessary and undue hardship. Five affirmative votes shall be necessary to approve any variance request.

The Board of Adjustment shall serve as the city's floodplain management board in reviewing applications for properties within its jurisdiction and shall have the authority to exercise all powers and perform all duties assigned to such board pursuant to section 54-31 et seq. and Resolution No. 93-20698, and in accordance with the procedures set forth therein as such ordinance and resolution may be amended from time to time. For the purposes of determining jurisdiction, the criteria in section 118-351(a) shall be utilized.

The Board of Adjustment shall consist of seven voting members.

Members shall be appointed for a two-year term, by a five-sevenths vote of the City Commission.

Two members shall be appointed as citizens at-large, and five professional members shall each be appointed as follows: A) One member shall represent the architecture profession, and the remaining four members shall represent one of the following professions (no more than one member per profession) namely: 1) law, 2) engineering, 3) real estate development, 4) certified public accounting, 5) financial consultation, and 6) general business.

The members representing the professions of architecture, law, engineering, and public accounting shall be duly licensed by the State of Florida; the member representing general business shall be of responsible standing in the community, the member representing the field of financial consultation shall be a certified public accountant, chartered financial analyst, certified financial planner, a chartered financial consultant or investment advisor registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, or someone recognized as having similar credentials and duly licensed by the State of Florida.

Members of the board of adjustment must either be residents or have their principal place of business in Miami Beach.

Design Review Board

Composition:

(a) The Design Review Board shall be composed of seven regular members. Seven (7) regular members shall consist of:

1. One architect registered in the United States;
2. An architect registered in the State of Florida or a member of the faculty of the school of architecture, urban planning, or urban design in the State, with practical or academic expertise in the field of design, planning, historic preservation or the history of architecture, or a professional practicing in the fields of architectural design, or urban planning;
3. One landscape architect registered in the State of Florida;
4. One architect registered in the United States, or a professional practicing in the fields of architectural or urban design, or urban planning, or a resident with demonstrated interest or background in design issues; or an attorney in good standing licensed to practice law within the United States;
5. Two persons who are residents at-large and who currently reside in the city and have resided in the city for at least (3) three consecutive years at the time of appointment or reappointment. Additionally, strong preference shall be given to individuals who have previously served on a Miami Beach board or committee and/or completed the Miami Beach Leadership Academy course, and to individuals not currently working in the fields of real estate development, real estate brokerage/sales, real estate law, or architecture; and
6. (i) A licensed professional engineer, licensed professional architect, or licensed professional landscape architect with expertise in water resources; (ii) a person licensed by the State of Florida in hydrology, water or wastewater treatment; (iii) a person with a degree from an accredited college or university in a field of study related to water resources; or (iv) a floodplain manager or a principal community administrator responsible for the daily implementation of flood loss reduction activities including enforcing a community's flood damage prevention ordinance, updating flood maps, plans, and policies of the community, and any of the activities related to administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (a "water management expert").

One person appointed by the City Manager from an eligibility list provided by the Disability Access Committee shall serve in an advisory capacity with no voting authority. The Planning Director or designee, and the City Attorney or designee, shall serve in an advisory capacity.

(b) Design Review Board members shall be appointed with the occurrence of at least four members of the city commission. An eligibility list for these professional membership categories may include, but shall not be limited to, suggestions from the following professional and civic associations as listed below:

- (1) American Institute of Architects, local chapter.
- (2) American Society of Landscape Architects, local chapter.
- (3) The Miami Design Alliance.
- (4) American Planning Association, local chapter.
- (5) The Miami Design Preservation League and Dade Heritage Trust.
- (6) Other city civic, neighborhood and property owner associations.

(c) Residency and or place of business. All regular members shall reside in or have their primary place of business in the county, except for the water management expert appointed pursuant to subsection (a)(6), who need not reside in or have a principal place of business in the county, and except as otherwise provided in subsection (a)(5). The two resident at-large members and one of the registered landscape architects, registered architects, or professionals practicing in the fields of architectural or urban design or urban planning shall be residents of the city.

General Obligation (G.O.) Bond Oversight Committee

Composition:

The purpose of the General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee is to make advisory recommendations to the City Manager and the City Commission from a macro perspective regarding the timely progress, overall goals, costs, including financial efficiencies, and the timely completion of General Obligation Bond Program ("G.O. Bond Program") projects approved by the voters in the City of Miami Beach Special Elections held on November 6, 2018 and November 8, 2022.

The General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee shall be composed of fourteen (14) members as follows:

Eight (8) at-large, voting members, with staggered terms, appointed by the City Commission as follows:

- (1) two City residents from the North Beach area;
- (2) two City residents from the Mid-Beach area; and
- (3) two City residents from the South Beach area.
- (4) two City residents from any geographic area of the City with experience working with cultural/arts organizations, including with respect to operations, facilities management or design.

One direct appointment by the Mayor who shall be a voting member and a resident of any area of the City, and who shall serve as chair of the Committee.

Five (5) ex-officio, non-voting members as follows:

- (1) a designee of the City's Audit Committee;
- (2) a designee of the City's Parks and Recreational Facilities Board;
- (3) a designee of the City's Budget Advisory Committee; and
- (4) a designee of the City's Sustainability Committee.
- (5) a designee of the City's Cultural Arts Council.

The voting members shall serve two-year terms.

(1) The term limits for the voting members set forth in subsection (a)(1)-(3) shall be governed by the term limits set forth in Section 2-22(5)(b) of the City Code for at-large appointees.

(2) The term limits for the chair of the Committee shall be governed by the term limits set forth in Section 2-22 (5)(a) of the City Code for direct appointees.

Each of the nine (9) voting members must demonstrate a high degree of knowledge or expertise in one or more of the following areas or disciplines:

- (1) Banking/Finance;
- (2) Construction;
- (3) Real Estate Development;
- (4) Construction Management;
- (5) Recreational or Cultural/Arts Operations, Facilities Management/Design;
- (6) Architecture;
- (7) Landscape Design/Landscape Architecture;
- (8) Public Safety/Security Systems;
- (9) Public Works;
- (10) Public Facilities;
- (11) Engineering;
- (12) Urban Planning/Design;
- (12) Resiliency/Environmental Management;
- (14) Communications; or
- (15) Neighborhood Leadership.

The main supporting departments for the General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee shall be the City Manager's Office, the Finance Department, the Capital Improvements Projects Department, and the Facilities & Fleet Department. The City Attorney's Office shall provide counsel to the Committee and the City's Office of the Inspector General shall provide oversight.

(i) A licensed professional engineer, licensed professional architect, or licensed professional landscape architect with expertise in water resources; (ii) a person licensed by the State of Florida in hydrology, water or wastewater treatment; (iii) a person with a degree from an accredited college or university in a field of study related to water resources; or (iv) a floodplain manager or a principal community administrator responsible for the daily implementation of flood loss reduction activities including enforcing a community's flood damage prevention ordinance, updating flood maps, plans, and policies of the community, and any of the activities related to administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (a "water management expert"), each of the foregoing with professional experience and demonstrated interest in historic preservation.
6. A member of the faculty of a school of architecture in the State of Florida, with academic expertise in the field of design and historic preservation or the history of architecture, with a preference for an individual with practical experience in architecture and the preservation of historic structures.

All members of the Board except the architect, university faculty member, and water management expert shall be residents of the City; provided, however, that the City Commission may waive the residency requirement (if applicable) by a 5/7th vote, in the event a person not meeting the residency requirement is available to serve on the Board and is exceptionally qualified by training and/or experience in historic preservation matters. All appointments shall be made on the basis of civic pride, integrity, experience and interest in the field of historic preservation.

Miami Beach Commission For Women

Composition:

Purpose.

The purpose of the commission is to support continuing efforts for economic, political and social equality of opportunity for all women, with special emphasis on the needs of women in the city and to serve in an advisory capacity to the city commission and the city administration.

Powers and duties.

The commission shall have the following duties, functions, powers and responsibilities:

- (1) To serve in an advisory capacity to the city commission, the city administration, the community and all agencies and persons in the city in respect to all matters pertaining to the status of women, including, but not limited to, discrimination against women, greater representation for women in all areas of city government, i.e., boards and committees, employment of women, education of women and attitudes towards women in the community, and to make periodic reports and recommendations to these bodies in respect to such matters.
- (2) To make a continuing study of all existing city institutions, facilities and services, and programs dealing with women or affecting women, and consider the future needs of this area in respect to such institutions, facilities, services and programs.
- (3) To serve as liaison between the city commission and the city administration, and consult with representatives of such bodies from time to time as requested and necessary in order to carry out the commission's duties and functions.
- (4) To make studies and have studies made of the problems of discrimination against women employees, increasing the availability of part time employment for women, and attributable changes towards women in the community, and to formulate and recommend plans and programs for the coordination of the activities of all governmental entities and nongovernmental agencies dealing with these problems.
- (5) It is the express purpose of this commission to serve as a medium for responsible persons to utilize and consult with in attempting to understand and solve the many complex problems involved with dealing with the status of women, and to make findings and recommendations to the city commission and the city administration regarding such matters as are presented to the commission.
- (6) To perform such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to it by resolution of the city commission.

Neighborhood Resiliency Projects Advisory Committee

Composition:

Purpose.

The purpose of the Neighborhood Resilience Projects Advisory Committee is to act as an advisory board to City Commission and City Manager on neighborhood infrastructure programs and private property matters related to the City's resilience projects. This includes helping build awareness of existing and future projects within the community and seeking resident ideas and feedback to improve the planning and delivery of future projects. The Committee will not advise on matters that have specifically been reviewed by the City Commission to avoid creating fiscal impacts or undue delays in the implementation of critical resiliency projects.

Powers and duties

The committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Provide advisory recommendations and feedback on best approaches to enhance resident education and resident engagement.
- (2) Provide advisory recommendations and feedback regarding process improvements for flood mitigation.
- (3) Share input and evaluate general neighborhood aesthetics and utility and infrastructure improvements, such as location decision criteria for pump stations or other improvements.
- (4) Provide a forum for the Committee to share best practices and lessons learned from completed projects and/or ongoing projects, for potential incorporation as part of future projects.

Composition

The committee shall be composed of seven (7) members. all of whom shall be appointed to serve for a term of no more than two (2) years at a time. Each member of the city commission shall make one (1) direct appointment to the committee.

(1) The seven (7) members shall be affiliated with the city pursuant to the general requirements in section 2-22 of the City Code. In addition. the members must meet the following requirements:

(2) General Requirements. Each of the seven (7) members must have a demonstrated interest in flood mitigation, sea level rise and adaptation, infrastructure, and/or neighborhood leadership issues, including, without limitation, academia, homeowners associations, condominium associations, cooperatives. civic groups, or other similar qualifications. It would be beneficial if members have expertise in the following fields:

- a) Civil engineering or related background with a focus on infrastructure
- b) Architecture. landscape architecture, or related field with a focus on neighborhood planning
- c) Public engagement or communications for construction or neighborhood planning or similar
- d) Emergency management planning, or disaster or flood mitigation.

The purpose of the North Beach CRA Advisory Committee is to make advisory recommendations to the Administration and the City Commission regarding the North Beach CRA.

Powers and duties:

The Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Provide advisory recommendations regarding the implementation of the North Beach CRA Redevelopment Plan and projects which would be funded by the North Beach CRA, including recommendations relative to the overall timing, cost efficiencies, and prioritization of proposed North Beach CRA-funded projects.
- (2) Provide advisory recommendations regarding the Interlocal Agreement or amendments thereto, between Miami-Dade County and the City of Miami Beach relating to the North Beach CRA, and all related matters pertaining to the North Beach CRA.
- (3) Provide supplemental recommendations regarding matters that are not strictly within the established boundaries, but directly impact and affect the North Beach CRA district including, but not limited to climate, traffic, air pollution, and water quality matters.

Composition; knowledge and experience:

The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) at-large appointments, all of whom shall be appointed to serve for a term of no more than two (2) years at a time.

The seven (7) members shall be affiliated with the City in the following ways:

(1) Resident Members.

- a. At least one (1) of the seven members must currently reside for a minimum of five (5) years within the North Beach area generally considered as that portion of Miami Beach located north of 63rd Street.
- b. At least three (3) of the seven members must currently reside for a minimum of five (5) years within the geographic boundaries of the North Beach CRA or within a 300-foot radius thereof.
- c. The five (5) year minimum residency requirement in subsections (1)(a) and (1)(b) may be waived upon a 5/7ths vote of the city commission, in the event a resident within the applicable geographic area is available to serve on the committee and is exceptionally qualified by training and/or experience.

(2) Business Member. At least one (1) of the seven members must demonstrate an Ownership Interest for a minimum of five (5) years in a Business established within the geographic boundaries of the North Beach CRA, without regard to that person's residency. A candidate who satisfies requirements as both a Resident and Business Owner may qualify for either the Resident Member category or the Business Member category pursuant to this subsection.

(3) Real Estate Industry Member. At least one (1) of the seven members of the Committee must be a real estate industry professional, residing generally within the City of Miami Beach.

(4) Attorney Member. At least one (1) of the seven members of the Committee must be an attorney with experience in land use, real estate, or other related practice area, residing generally within the City of Miami Beach or maintaining a full-time law practice and physical office located in North Beach.

(5) General Requirements. Each of the seven (7) members must have a demonstrated interest in neighborhood leadership issues, including, without limitation, neighborhood business groups, homeowner or condominium associations and cooperatives, civic groups, and/or other similar qualifications.

For the purposes of this section:

- "Ownership Interest" shall mean the ownership of ten percent (10%) or more of a Business (including the ownership of 10% or more of the outstanding capital stock).
- "Business" shall mean any sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability company but shall exclude either a business engaged in the real estate industry (including development, brokerage, or property management), or a law firm, as individuals practicing in either of those areas would be covered under the Real Estate Industry Member category in subsection 2-190.151 (3) herein or the Attorney Member category in subsection 2-190.151(4)

Planning Board

Composition:

For Planning Board powers and duties, please refer to Sec. 118-51 of the Miami Beach Code of Ordinances.

(a) The Planning Board shall be composed of seven regular voting members. Each regular member shall be appointed with the concurrence of at least four members of the city commission. Each regular voting member shall serve for a term of two years. The planning director or designee, and the city attorney or designee, shall serve in an advisory capacity.

(b) All regular voting members of the board shall have considerable experience in general business, land development practices or land use issues; however, the board shall at a minimum be comprised of:

1. One architect registered in the State of Florida; or a member of the faculty of a school of architecture in the state, with practical or academic expertise in the field of design, planning, historic preservation or the history of architecture; or a landscape architect registered in the state of Florida; or a professional practicing in the fields of architectural or urban design, or urban planning;
2. One developer who has experience in developing real property; or an attorney in good standing licensed to practice law within the United States;
3. One attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Florida who has considerable experience in land use and zoning issues;
4. One person who has education and/or experience in historic preservation issues. For purposes of this section, the term "education and/or experience in historic preservation issues" shall be a person who meets one or more of the following criteria:

- a. Has earned a college degree in historic preservation;
- b. Is responsible for the preservation, revitalization or adaptive reuse of historic buildings; or
- c. Is recognized by the city commission for contributions to historic preservation, education or planning;

5. Two (2) persons who are residents at-large and who currently reside in the city and have resided in the city for at least (3) three consecutive years at the time of appointment or reappointment. Additionally, strong preference shall be given to individuals who have previously served on a Miami Beach board or committee and/or completed the Miami Beach Leadership Academy course, and to individuals not currently working in the fields of real estate development, real estate brokerage/sales, real estate law, or architecture; and

6. (i) A licensed professional engineer, licensed professional architect, or licensed professional landscape architect with expertise in water resources; (ii) a person licensed by the State of Florida in hydrology, water or wastewater treatment; (iii) a person with a degree from an accredited college or university in a field of study related to water resources; or (iv) a floodplain manager or a principal community administrator responsible for the daily implementation of flood loss reduction activities including enforcing a community's flood damage prevention ordinance, updating flood maps, plans, and policies of the community, and any of the activities related to administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (a "water management expert").

(c) Except as provided in subsection (b)(5) no person except a resident of the City, who has resided in the City for at least one year, shall be eligible for appointment to the Planning Board. The residency requirement in this subsection (c) shall not apply to the water management expert appointed to the planning board pursuant to subsection (b)(6).

(d) The City Commission may waive the residency requirements by a 5/7ths vote in the event a person not meeting these requirements is available to serve on the Board and is exceptionally qualified by training and/or experience.

Program for Public Information (PPI) Committee

Composition:

The goals of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's ("FEMA") National Flood Insurance Program ("NFIP") are to provide flood insurance to property owners, to encourage flood loss reduction activities by communities, and to save taxpayers' money.

The City of Miami Beach participates in the NFIP and the Community Rating System ("CRS"), a voluntary program that provides both incentives and tools to further these goals.

Participation in the CRS saves residents money by reducing flood insurance premiums.

The Program for Public Information ("PPI") provides activity points to improve the City's CRS score, which in turn helps to reduce flood insurance premiums.

An ad hoc advisory Resiliency Communications Committee was first created per Resolution No. 2016-29585 to serve as a PPI Committee from October 1, 2016 through October 1, 2017, and has been renewed every year since.

The latest advisory ad hoc Program for Public Information Committee was created pursuant to Resolution 2021- 31936, and will expire on December 31, 2022.

A PPI was developed by the initial ad hoc PPI Committee, according to a seven-step planning and public involvement process, defined by the CRS Program, and the PPI was adopted by the Mayor and City Commission per Resolution No. 2017- 29771.

Membership criteria for a PPI Committee is specified by CRS and must include: real estate agent(s), insurance agent(s), banking industry representative(s), the City's Floodplain Manager, and a Communications Department representative, and at least half of the Committee's members must be from outside the local government.

A new Program for Public Information Plan is required every five years, and on June 16, 2022 the Committee approved the new 2022 PPI to be transmitted to City Commission.

On July 20, 2022, the Mayor and City Commission adopted the Program for Public Information Plan via Resolution No. 2022-32216.

The City Manager recommends that the Mayor and City Commission accept the 2022 Report, attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A.

The members of the new ad hoc advisory PPI Committee (the Committee") shall be as follows:

The City's Communications Director; the City's Floodplain Manager; Scott Diffenderfer, as real estate agent; Carlos Gutierrez, a real estate agent; Alex Carrasco, a local bank representative; and John Lee, a local insurance agent.

The membership term on the new ad hoc Committee shall commence on January 1, 2023 and expire on December 31, 2023, subject to earlier or later sunset by the City Commission.

(5) A resident of Stella Maris House selected by the board of directors of Stella Maris House.

(6) A resident of Rebecca Towers selected by the board of commissioners of the Miami Beach Housing Authority.

(7) A resident of Council Towers North who shall be recommended by the residents of Council Towers North and ratified by the city commission.

(8) A resident of Council Towers South who shall be recommended by the residents of Council Towers South and ratified by the city commission.

(9) A resident of Federation Towers who shall be recommended by the residents of Federation Towers and ratified by the city commission.

(10) An individual selected by the board of directors of UNIDAD of Miami Beach.

(11) The chairperson of the Hispanic Affairs Committee, or the chairperson's designee.

The members referenced in subsection (a) above shall be 55 years of age or older or have a demonstrated interest and involvement in senior citizen services, issues, activities, or facilities at the time of appointment.

The Committee shall consist of 14 voting members. The Mayor and City Commissioners shall each make one direct appointment, with the other seven members of the Committee to be comprised of either City Business owners or members from the following community organizations, each of whom shall be appointed by majority vote of the City Commission:

- (1) Miami Beach Chamber of Commerce's Transportation and Parking Committee;
- (2) A South Beach neighborhood association;
- (3) A South Beach business owner or a South Beach business association;
- (4) A Mid-Beach neighborhood association;
- (5) A Mid-Beach business owner or a Mid-Beach business association;
- (6) A North Beach neighborhood association; and
- (7) A North Beach business owner or a North Beach business association.

For the purposes of this section, terms set forth below shall have the following meaning:

South Beach: boundaries south of 23rd Street;

Mid-Beach: boundaries between 23rd Street and 63rd Street;

North Beach: boundaries north of 63rd Street

City Business Owner: an individual with an ownership or interest for a minimum of six months in a business established in the city for a minimum of six months. Ownership Interest shall mean the ownership of ten percent (10%) or more (including the ownership of 10% or more of the outstanding capital stock) in a business. Business shall mean any sole proprietorship, sponsorship, corporation, limited liability company, or other entity or business association.

On an annual basis, the members of the committee shall elect a chairperson and such other officers as may be deemed necessary or desirable, who shall serve at the will of the committee. Seven members shall consist of a quorum of the committee and shall be necessary in order to take any action.

Youth Commission

Composition:

The Purpose of the Youth Commission is to provide the youth of Miami Beach with a vehicle to learn about government, participate in the process of City government, represent and articulate the needs of youth in the City, and provide recommendations to the Mayor and City Commissioners on issues and programs affecting the youth and teen population in the City.

(a) The Youth Commission shall be composed of seven (7) voting members.

(b) The Mayor and each City Commissioner shall appoint one member to the youth commission as a direct appointment. Members must be residents of the City of Miami Beach. Members must be enrolled in a public or private school in Miami-Dade County. Members shall be 15 through 18 years old at the time of appointment and be enrolled in the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade. To be qualified for appointment, a student must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average and demonstrate a sincere interest in municipal government, be motivated to contribute to the betterment of the city and have a background in community-based activity.

(c) The term of office for each member shall be one (1) year. Members may be appointed for (1) subsequent one-year term; provided, however, that no member shall serve on or after his/her nineteenth (19th) birthday. In addition, board member terms shall automatically expire upon the latter of December 31 of the year of the appointing City Commission member leaves office or upon the appointment/election of the successor City Commission member.

(d) Youth Commission Members shall annually elect a member as chairperson, and other officers it deems necessary. A vote of a majority of the members shall be required to constitute action taken by the Youth Commission.
