Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board Composition:

Pursuant to Miami Beach City Charter Section 8.91, the "Charter shall be reviewed ten (10) years from November 3, 1993 and each tenth year thereafter." Periodic review of the City Charter is in the public interest to ensure the City Charter reflects the organization, powers and essential functions of City government desired by the City's voters. The next required Charter review is scheduled to take place in 2023; however, nothing in the Charter precludes the City Commission from initiating Charter review at an earlier date. A review of the City's Charter has previously been accomplished by the creation and appointment of an Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board ("Ad Hoc Board") to be composed of seven members appointed by the Mayor and City Commission. There are currently multiple proposals by several Commissioners on how to address City Commission vacancies, and creation of the Ad Hoc Board is necessary to provide the Committee sufficient time to thoughtfully deliberate and make recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission. As such, the Mayor and City Commission desire to initiate the Charter Review process immediately, and to convene the Committee as soon as reasonably possible in order to give the Committee sufficient time to thoroughly vet and deliberate all proposals regarding filling City Commission vacancies and review and make recommendations with regard to other provisions of the City Charter.

The Board to is be composed of 7 direct appointments by the Mayor and individual City Commissioners.

At the June 20, 2022, City Commission meeting, the Mayor and City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2022-32234, establishing the Ad Hoc Advisory Charter Review and Revision Board ("Charter Review Board"). Unfortunately, due to the untimely passing of Commissioner Mark Samuelian, the Charter Review Board was unable to commence its work for approximately six (6) months, and was not fully constituted until after December 14, 2022, when the Mayor and City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2022-32448, to provide for newly elected Group II City Commissioner Laura Dominguez to make a direct appointment to the Charter Review Board. At its April 25, 2023 meeting, the Charter Review Board unanimously recommended that the Mayor and City Commission extend the term of the Board for six months, to allow the Board sufficient time to gather input from the City's Charter Officers, Elected Officials, and other interested stakeholders, and carefully vet proposed amendments to the City Charter. The Charter Review Board further recommends that the City follow the precedent set by the Charter Review Board of 2013/14 and elect not to place proposed Charter amendments on the same ballot as the 2023 General Election, at which the City's voters will be electing the Mayor and three City Commissioners, in an effort to avoid unduly politicizing Charter questions and, instead, submit any Charter-related ballot questions to the voters as part of the November 5, 2024 election. The Charter Review Board aims to conclude its fact-finding, research, and recommendations by May or June of 2024, to allow the City Commission sufficient time to review proposed Charter amendments, and corresponding ballot questions, prior to the Miami-Dade County Elections Department's deadline for the November 5, 2024 ballot.

On May 17, 2023, the Mayor and City Commission amended Resolution No. 2022-32448 to extend the term of the City of Miami Beach Ad Hoc Charter Review and Revision Board ("Charter Review Board") for an additional six (6) month period, with the new sunset date to be June 30, 2024, in order to provide the Charter Review Board with sufficient time to thoughtfully deliberate and make recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission regarding proposed amendments to the City Charter, for potential consideration by the City's voters as part of the November 5, 2024 election.

1. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission for the electrical engineer member.
- 3. The composition of the Committee shall be as follows:
- a. Resident Members.
- i. At least two (2) of the seven members must currently reside within the North Beach area, generally considered as that portion of Miami Beach located north of 63rd Street.
- ii. At least two (2) of the seven members must currently reside within Mid Beach area, generally considered as that portion of Miami Beach located south of 63rd Street and north of 23rd Street.
- iii. At least two (2) of the seven members must currently reside within the South Beach area, generally considered as that portion of Miami Beach located south of 23rd Street.
- b. Technical Member. At least one (1) of the seven members must be an electrical engineer, preferably with expertise in urban lighting.
- 4. The Mayor and City Commission will consider the following additional criteria when making appointments:
- a. Applicable knowledge and experience relevant to the Committee's purpose.

The foregoing requirement may be waived by majority vote of the City Commission for individuals with specific knowledge or expertise relative to historic preservation processes. Notwithstanding the foregoing, members appointed in categories (3)(d) through (f) shall be residents of the City of Miami Beach.
- 3. Members shall possess the following knowledge and expertise:
- a. An individual with financial expertise.
- b. An individual with real estate development expertise.
- c. An individual with construction expertise, particularly as to the renovation and restoration of historic buildings.
- d. A former member of the City's Historic Preservation Board.
- e. An individual with preservation experience, who also currently resides in a local historic district.
- f. A representative nominated by the Miami Design Preservation League (MDPL).
- g. An attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Florida.
- 4. Members of the Committee shall select a chairperson by majority vote at the Committee's first meeting.
- C. Power and Duties

The Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- a. To request the presence of a representative from the Planning Department, as needed at its meetings.
- b. To generate recommendations based on the Committee's insights, experiences, and observations.

Ad Hoc Iguana Remediation Advisory Committee Composition:

A. Purpose

- 1. On June 28, 2023, Resolution No. 2023-32650 re-established the Ad Hoc Iguana Remediation Advisory Committee for a period of one year (subject to earlier or later sunset by the City Commission), to study what actions other jurisdictions have taken to address iguana invasions and making recommendations to the Mayor and City Commission regarding iguana mitigation removal options.
- 2. The Committee will meet on a monthly basis, or as frequently as the Committee deems necessary to make final recommendations. The Committee will sunset on June 28, 2024, unless determined by the Mayor and City Commission that it should be extended.
- B. Membership Composition
- 1. The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) direct appointments made by individual City Commissioners and the Mayor.
- 2. Membership criteria for the Committee: individuals must be residents of the City for a minimum of two (2) years, or demonstrate ownership/interest in, or employment relationship with a business established in the City for a minimum of two (2) years. Exceptions to the foregoing may be approved by a majority vote of the City Commission for individuals with specific knowledge or expertise relative to iguana remediation or other invasive nonnative species remediation.

C. Powers and duties

The Committee will serve to study actions taken by other jurisdictions to prevent, eradicate, and control the spread of invasive iguanas and advise the City Manager and the City Commission on potential actions available to the City in addition to contracting with an iguana mitigation and removal services, including, without limitation, recommendations regarding the Administration's competitive solicitation for iguana mitigation providers.

D. Conflict of interest.

In accordance with Florida law, under circumstances presenting a conflict of interest, an advisory board member should abstain from voting with respect to any measure in which the advisory board member has a personal, private, or professional interest and which inures to his special private gain or the special gain of a principal by whom he is retained. The City Attorney's Office liaison shall assist advisory board members in addressing any potential voting conflicts, as necessary.

E. Administrative Liaison

The supporting departments for the Committee shall be the City Manager's Office, and the Public Works Department. The City Attorney's Office shall provide counsel to the Committee.

A quorum shall consist of three (3) or more members.

- 6. One citizen actively engaged as a not-for-profit provider of affordable housing;
- 7. One citizen actively engaged as a real estate professional in connection with affordable housing;
- 8. One citizen who actively serves on the local planning agency pursuant to Florida Statute §163.3174 (Planning Board member);
- 9. One citizen who resides within the jurisdiction of the local governing body making the appointments;
- 10. One citizen who represents employers within the jurisdiction;
- 11. One citizen who represents essential services personnel, as defined in the local housing assistance plan.

If the City, due to the presence of a conflict of interest by prospective appointees, or other reasonable factor, is unable to appoint a citizen actively engaged in these activities in connection with affordable housing, a citizen engaged in the activity without regard to affordable housing may be appointed.

The individual members of the City Commission may supplement the committee's suggested list with additional names of candidates or, if neither the candidates on the committee's suggested list nor the additional names submitted by the individual members of the City Commission are approved, the committee shall submit an entirely different list for the Mayor and City Commission's Consideration. This process shall continue until a suitable replacement has been found to fill the existing or anticipated vacancy. The suggested list submitted by the committee for the Mayor and City Commission's consideration shall be submitted without specific recommendations or endorsements by the committee as to any particular name submitted therein, but may, in the event the name of a current committee member is submitted for reappointment, indicate, as a point of information to the Mayor and City Commission, that said name is that of an existing committee member.

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Board of Adjustment

Composition:

The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) To hear and decide appeals pursuant to the procedural requirements of Section 118-9.
- (2) To authorize, upon application, such variance from the terms of these land development regulations where authorized by section 118-351(a), pursuant to the requirements of chapter 118, article VIII, of the land development regulations, as will not be contrary to the public interest when, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of a provision of these land development regulations would result in unnecessary and undue hardship. Five affirmative votes shall be necessary to approve any variance request.

RSA Art. I Sec. 2 118-131 Reso 2022-32165

The Board of Adjustment shall serve as the city's floodplain management board in reviewing applications for properties within its jurisdiction and shall have the authority to exercise all powers and perform all duties assigned to such board pursuant to section 54-31 et seq. and Resolution No. 93-20698, and in accordance with the procedures set forth therein as such ordinance and resolution may be amended from time to time. For the purposes of determining jurisdiction, the criteria in section 118-351(a) shall be utilized.

The Board of Adjustment shall consist of seven voting members.

Law (1)

Members shall be appointed for a two-year term, by a five-sevenths vote of the City Commission.

Two members shall be appointed as citizens at-large, and five professional members shall each be appointed as follows: A) One member shall represent the architecture profession, and the remaining four members shall represent one of the following professions (no more than one member per profession) namely: 1) law, 2) engineering, 3) real estate development, 4) certified public accounting, 5) financial consultation, and 6) general business.

The members representing the professions of architecture, law, engineering, and public accounting shall be duly licensed by the State of Florida; the member representing general business shall be of responsible standing in the community, the member representing the field of financial consultation shall be a certified public accountant, chartered financial analyst, certified financial planner, a chartered financial consultant or investment advisor registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, or someone recognized as having similar credentials and duly licensed by the State of Florida.

Members of the board of adjustment must either be residents or have their principal place of business in Miami Beach.

Additionally, strong preference shall be given to individuals who have previously served on a Miami Beach board or committee and/or completed the Miami Beach Leadership Academy course, and to individuals not currently working in the fields of real estate development, real estate brokerage/sales, real estate law, or architecture; and
- 6. (a) A licensed professional engineer, licensed professional architect, or licensed professional landscape architect with expertise in water resources; (b) a person licensed by the State of Florida in hydrology, water or wastewater treatment; (c) a person with a degree from an accredited college or university in a field of study related to water resources; (d) a floodplain manager or a principal community administrator responsible for the daily implementation of flood loss reduction activities including enforcing a community's flood damage prevention ordinance, updating flood maps, plans, and policies of the community, and any of the activities related to administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (a "water management expert"); or (e) a person who is a resident at-large and currently resides in the city and has resided in the city for at least three consecutive years at the time of appointment or reappointment.

One person appointed by the City Manager from an eligibility list provided by the Disability Access Committee shall serve in an advisory capacity with no voting authority. The Planning Director or designee, and the City Attorney or designee, shall serve in an advisory capacity.

The two resident at-large members and one of the registered landscape architects, registered architects, or professionals practicing in the fields of architectural or urban design or urban planning shall be residents of the city.

- (1) Make periodic reports and advisory non-binding recommendations to the city manager or the city commission for the improvement of standards for the city in marine-related matters to promote and maintain a safe clean and healthy marine environment to be enjoyed by the city's residents and visitors. This shall include working in cooperation with federal, state, and local agencies interested in marine standards and clean and clear waterways; and to publicizing the importance of adequate standards; and holding and conducting public hearings, discussions, forums and institutes to arrange programs for the presentation of information by experts in related fields.
- (2) Foster and maintain a clean, litter-free marine environment by exploring the availability of enforcement techniques, new ordinances, and the active promotion of voluntary cleanups.
- (3) Make recommendations regarding any ongoing and future waterside activities including the permitting and policing of water-related and beach concessions, wateroriented and marine-related special events, and marine and waterfront environmental issues.
- (4) Make recommendations to the city manager and the city commission regarding potential suspension or revocation of business tax receipts for commercial charter operators that engage in nuisance or habitual unlawful activities. The City Manager shall respond to any recommendation made pursuant to this subsection within 30 days.
- (5) The investigation, development, and carrying out of plans for the preservation and renourishment of the beaches in the city, including, but not limited to, erosion control.
- (6) To foster and maintain a clean, safe, and litter-free beach environment by exploring the availability of enforcement techniques, programs, or new legislation to accomplish these goals.
- (7) The encouragement of a desire in the citizenry and visitors to the city to maintain and preserve the city's beaches.
- (8) The recommendation of plans to the city manager, city commission, as well as to other local, state, and federal governmental agencies, for the preservation and nourishment of the city's beaches.
- (9) The authority's power of review and recommendation set forth hereinabove shall apply as well to such matters concerning maintenance of city boardwalks, beach walks, cutwalk and baywalks.

The committee shall be composed of seven (7) members. all of whom shall be appointed to serve for a term of no more than two (2) years at a time. Each member of the city commission shall make one (1) direct appointment to the committee.

The purpose of the North Beach CRA Advisory Committee is to make advisory recommendations to the Administration and the City Commission regarding the North Beach CRA.

Powers and duties:

The Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Provide advisory recommendations regarding the implementation of the North Beach CRA Redevelopment Plan and projects which would be funded by the North Beach CRA, including recommendations relative to the overall timing, cost efficiencies, and prioritization of proposed North Beach CRA-funded projects.
- (2) Provide advisory recommendations regarding the Interlocal Agreement or amendments thereto, between Miami-Dade County and the City of Miami Beach relating to the North Beach CRA, and all related matters pertaining to the North Beach CRA.

Composition; knowledge and experience:

The Committee shall be composed of seven (7) at-large appointments, all of whom shall be appointed to serve for a term of no more than two (2) years at a time. There shall also be one (1) nonvoting, ex-officio representative of the Normandy Fountain Business Association, who shall not count toward a quorum for the Committee.

The seven (7) members shall be affiliated with the City in the following ways:

- (1) Resident Members.
- a. At least one (1) of the seven members must currently reside for a minimum of five (5) years within the North Beach area generally considered as that portion of Miami Beach located north of 63rd Street.
- b. At least three (3) of the seven members must currently reside. for a minimum of five (5) years within the geographic boundaries of the North Beach CRA or within a 300-foot radius thereof.

At least one (1) of the seven members must demonstrate an Ownership Interest for a minimum of five (5) years in a Business established within the geographic boundaries of the North Beach CRA, without regard to that person's residency. A candidate who satisfies requirements as both a Resident and Business Owner may qualify for either the Resident Member category or the Business Member category pursuant to this subsection.
- (3) Real Estate Industry Member. At least one (1) of the seven members of the Committee must be a real estate industry professional, residing generally within the City of Miami Beach.
- (4) Attorney Member. At least one (1) of the seven members of the Committee must be an attorney with experience in land use, real estate, or other related practice area, residing generally within the City of Miami Beach or maintaining a full-time law practice and physical office located in North Beach.
- (5) General Requirements. Each of the seven (7) members must have a demonstrated interest in neighborhood leadership issues, including, without limitation, neighborhood business groups, homeowner or condominium associations and cooperatives, civic groups, and/or other similar qualifications.

- c. Is recognized by the city commission for contributions to historic preservation, education or planning;

Additionally, strong preference shall be given to individuals who have previously served on a Miami Beach board or committee and/or completed the Miami Beach Leadership Academy course, and to individuals not currently working in the fields of real estate development, real estate brokerage/sales, real estate law, or architecture; and
- 6. (a) A licensed professional engineer, licensed professional architect, or licensed professional landscape architect with expertise in water resources; (b) a person licensed by the State of Florida in hydrology, water or wastewater treatment; (c) a person with a degree from an accredited college or university in a field of study related to water resources; (d) a floodplain manager or a principal community administrator responsible for the daily implementation of flood loss reduction activities including enforcing a community's flood damage prevention ordinance, updating flood maps, plans, and policies of the community, and any of the activities related to administration of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) (a "water management expert"); or (e) a person who is a resident at-large and currently resides in the city and has resided in the city for at least three consecutive years at the time of appointment or reappointment.
- (c) Except as provided in subsection (b)(5) no person except a resident of the City, who has resided in the City for at least one year, shall be eligible for appointment to the Planning Board. The residency requirement in this subsection (c) shall not apply to the water management expert appointed to the planning board pursuant to subsection (b)(6).
- (d) The City Commission may waive the residency requirements by a 5/7ths vote in the event a person not meeting these requirements is available to serve on the Board and is exceptionally qualified by training and/or experience.

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Program for Public Information (PPI) Committee Composition:

Resolution No. 2022-32390 / 2023-32844

The goals of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's ("FEMA") National Flood Insurance Program ("NFIP") are to provide flood insurance to property owners, to encourage flood loss reduction activities by communities, and to save taxpayers' money.

The City of Miami Beach participates in the NFIP and the Community Rating System ("CRS"), a voluntary program that provides both incentives and tools to further these goals.

Participation in the CRS saves residents money by reducing flood insurance premiums.

The Program for Public Information ("PPI") provides activity points to improve the City's CRS score, which in turn helps to reduce flood insurance premiums.

An advisory ad hoc Resiliency Communications Committee was first created per Resolution No. 2016-29585 to serve as a PPI Committee from October 1, 2016 through October 1, 2017, and has been renewed every year since.

The latest PPI Committee was created, pursuant to Resolution 2022- 32390, and will expire on December 31, 2023; therefore, a new PPI Committee would need to be created in order for the City to continue to participate in the CRS.

A PPI was developed by the initial ad hoc PPI Committee, according to a seven-step planning and public involvement process, defined by the CRS Program, and the PPI was adopted by the Mayor and City Commission per Resolution No. 2017-29771.

A new PPI was developed by the ad hoc PPI Committee to update and replace the 2017 PPI, and the PPI was adopted by the Mayor and City Commission on July 20, 2022 per Resolution No. 2022-32216.

Membership criteria for a PPI Committee is specified by CRS and must include: real estate agent(s), insurance agent(s), banking industry representative(s), the City's Floodplain Manager, and a Communications Department representative, and at least half of the Committee's members must be from outside the local government.

An evaluation report is prepared annually by a PPI Committee and submitted to the City Commission.

On October 11, 2023, the PPI Committee, that was created per Resolution No. 2022-32390, approved the Annual Update and Evaluation Report to be transmitted to the City Commission.

The members of the new ad hoc advisory PPI Committee (the "Committee") shall be as follows: the City's Communications Director; the City's Floodplain Manager; Scott Diffenderfer, as real estate agent; Carlos Gutierrez, a real estate agent; Alex Carrasco, a local bank representative; and John Lee, a local insurance agent.

The powers and duties of the Committee will be to serve as a PPI Committee in accordance with NFIP requirements for credit under the CRS, to implement, monitor and evaluate the PPI, and to submit an annual evaluation report of the PPI to the City Commission.

The term of membership on the new ad hoc Committee shall commence on January 1, 2024 and expire on December 31, 2024, subject to earlier or later sunset by the City Commission.

Business shall mean any sole proprietorship, sponsorship, corporation, limited liability company, or other entity or business association.

On an annual basis, the members of the committee shall elect a chairperson and such other officers as may be deemed necessary or desirable, who shall serve at the will of the committee. Seven members shall consist of a quorum of the committee and shall be necessary in order to take any action.

To be qualified for appointment, a student must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average and demonstrate a sincere interest in municipal government, be motivated to contribute to the betterment of the city and have a background in community-based activity.
- (c) The term of office for each member shall be one (1) year. Members may be appointed for (1) subsequent one-year term; provided, however, that no member shall serve on or after his/her nineteenth (19th) birthday. In addition, board member terms shall automatically expire upon the latter of December 31 of the year of the appointing City Commission member leaves office or upon the appointment/election of the successor City Commission member.
- (d) Youth Commission Members shall annually elect a member as chairperson, and other officers it deems necessary. A vote of a majority of the members shall be required to constitute action taken by the Youth Commission. City Liaison: Dr. Leslie Rosenfeld
